Fungi form an isolated group within the plant kingdom and indeed are regarded by many as forming a separate kingdom of their own. They differ from all other plants by their lack of the green pigment chlorophyll, in the construction of thread-like units known as hyphae and their method of reproduction.

Reproduction occurs by spores either of sexual or asexual origin. The spore germinates, sending out a germ-tube that elongates to produce a thread-like, usually septate, filament that then branches out repeatedly. By continued ramification these threads or hyphae (singular hypha) form a cobweb or felt-like sheet known as mycelium. In most instances, fusion between two hyphae, usually from different mycelia, must occur before a fruit-body can be produced. Even then this process will only take place given the correct climatic factors and sufficient food supply. Fungi differ from the higher plant forms by the absence of the green pigment chlorophyll, which enables plants to photosynthesize. By this process green plants are able to obtain their carbohydrates; the chlorophyll in their leaves fixes atmospheric carbon dioxide in the presence of sunlight and water to manufacture sugar for their nutrition. As fungi are unable to do this they have to obtain their carbohydrates from decomposed animal or plant tissues. Hence they are found in habitats rich in rotting vegetation such as woodland, grassland, compost heaps, sawdust piles, on dung or manure heaps and on burnt ground colonized by moss. Fungi obtaining their food from these sources are known as saprophytes; others obtaining their food materials directly from living plants or animals are known as parasites. Examples of parasitic fungi on trees and herbaceous plants are the woody bracket fungi and mildews respectively; diseases of man such as athlete's foot, ringworm and farmer's lung are also caused by parasitic fungi.

Sir,

The humble submission of the complainant is as follows :

The complainant in C/W the said case is a very poor daily labourer. About a year ago, the complainant's daughter namely Smt. Sajna Begum was married to the accused person No.1 as per the provisions of Islam religion with the accused person No.4 as negotiator. At the time of marriage as per his capability the complainant gave things worth about rupees 5/6 thousand as had been demanded by the accused persons. After residing as well as cohabiting as husband and wife for a long period, the complainant's daughter Smt. Sajna Begum was made pregnant by the accused person No.1. Thereafter the complainant's son-in-law (accused person No.1) had developed an illicit relation with the wife of accused person No.2 i.e. the accused person No.3. The other accused persons came to know about this some days later and the accused persons numbering 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 gave information to the accused person No.4, brought her to their house at Gournagar and informed her about the illicit relation of accused person No.3 with the accused person No.1. Then accused person No.4 advised the other accused persons and since the complainant's daughter was 7/8 months pregnant, all the accused persons should jointly start inflicting physical and mental tortures upon Smt. Sajna Begum, the complainant's daughter and that Sajna Begum who was the wife of accused person No.1 and the daughter of the complainant should ask for Rs.15000/- from her father. If the complainant did not give Rs.15000/- as per their demand or if the complainant's daughter Sajna Begum expressed the matter of illicit relation between accused No.1 and the accused No.3 to anyone, then, the complainant's wife (the vernacular is so written ----- Translator) should be killed by all means. On giving this advice to the other accused persons the accused persons No.4 went away. Then onwards the other accused persons enhanced the rate of torture upon the complainant's daughter sent news to the poor father of the complainant (the vernacular is so written ----- Translator) that if Rs.15000/- (Rupees fifteen thousand) be not brought and given, then they ----- the accused persons would kill her. On 8.7.2001 A.D. last the accused person No.4 gave this information to the complainant's wife. Then the complainant's

wife took the complainant's son Khoka Miah and went to her daughter Sajna Begum's house at Gournagar at about 11 O'clock in the morning. On 8.7.2001 A.D. the complainant's wife and son went to the house of the accused and came to know that all the accused persons had a discussion amongst them, dealt first blows, kicks etc. Upon the complainant's daughter, gave her no rice, kept her starving and that they were telling the complainant's daughter that if her mother did not give the money on that day they would kill her on that very day itself. Then, with folded hands the complainant's wife and son requested the accused persons that in the month of Poush next (they) would give Rs.15000/- (Rupees fifteen thousand) as per the demand of the accused persons even if it be by way of selling the land and the complainant's wife said that on going to the complainant's house, the complainant's wife and son would tell (him) to arrange for the said money. Then, all the accused persons abused the complainant's wife and son by using filthy language and sent them away from the house of the accused persons. On chasing away the complainant's wife and son from their house all the accused persons made a conspiracy to kill the complainant's daughter Sajna Begum as per the advise given before by accused person No.4. Thereafter the accused persons killed the complainant's 7/8 months pregnant daughter Sajna Begum by delivering fist blows, kicks etc. Tied a rope on her neck and kept her hanging from the bamboo on the ceiling inside the hut and at about 7 O'clock night (they) started shouting that the complainant's daughter had died by way of hanging (herself) inside the hut. At about 9 O'clock night () sent information to the complainant that the complainant's daughter had died by way of hanging herself. Then the accused persons as had been pre-designed came to the Tejpur P.S., the police brought the deadbody from the house of the accused persons and kept it in the morgue of the Tejpur District Hospital before the complainant alongwith his nearby relatives could go to the house of the accused persons. As soon as the complainant alongwith his relatives came in front of the Tejpur P.S. the police stated that the deadbody was kept in the hospital. Nobody could see it then. Thereafter the complainant alongwith his relatives cried and went home. On the next day dated 9.7.2001 A.D. in the morning the complainant lodged a written complaint against the accused persons and the police told the complainant that he should take the deadbody of his daughter Sajna Begum and perform the last funeral rites. As per the words of the police the complainant then took away the deadbody of his daughter and performed the last funeral rites. Till then, none of the accused persons had come to the P.S. or to the hospital or that none had stated what had happened to the complainant's daughter. The police and the

doctor Shri Rupamoy Waddedar on being silenced by the accused persons, did not record any case. Being helpless, the complainant made a written prayer, before the S.P., Sonitpur, Tejpur and D.G. of Police, Assam on 13.7.2001 A.D. last seeking justice regarding the murder of the complainant's daughter Sajna Begum by the accused person. The complainant submitted a copy of this to the Tejpur P.S. too. But till today, the police did not lodge any case. On the day following the day of occurrence witness No.3 informed witness No.4 of Tinabazar that the accused persons often used to assault the complainant's daughter for dowry and because the incident of illicit relation between accused person No.1 and the accused No.3 came to light. As such the complainant being helpless, today presented himself before the Hon'ble court for getting proper justice.

Fatu Begam and consequent upon such continuous torture during her period of carrying till her death attributed to her which led her to end her life by strangulation at about 19.00 hours *(dusk) on 8.7.2001 at village Gournagar under P.S. Tejpur and as such you have committed an offence punishable U/S 304-B read with section 34 of I.P.C and within my cognizance.

SECONDLY- On 08.07.2001 at about 19.00 hours(dusk) at village Gournagar, under P.S. Tejpur, one Sajna Begam (now deceased), the legally married wife of Md. Sadak Ali, committed suicide by strangulation, due to cruelty or harassment both mental and physical, attributed to her continuously till her death by her husband, inmates and mediator of marriage in connection with demand for dowry and for raising protest by victim Sajna Begam for illicit relation of her husband with Musstt. Fatu Begam, the mother-in-law, of victim and Md. Tamij Ali, the negotiator of marriage , abetted the commission of suicide and thereby committed an offence punishable U/S 306 of

I.P.C and within my cognizance.

Gift as per my ability was given during marriage to my daughter. There was no further promises of any other gift. She lived together with her husband after marriage. The husband has his mother, namely Hatima Begam, his brother Satir Ali, and brother's wife Fatu Begam. After 5/6 months the daughter's husband demanded Rs. 15,000/- to my daughter for arranging the same to me. Some villagers reported me that my daughter was under torture for such money. As such I paid a visit to my daughter's house. When I went to her house I found her weeping, she reported to me either to pay Rs. 15,000/- as she was killed by her husband. Entire family members was creating pressure for the said money excepting elder brother. I told her husband to allow me some time to arrange the money. After few days I got information that she was under tremendous torture by her family members. I was worried for this position as my daughter was carrying. Accordingly I sent my wife and son to look into the matter. My wife and son made clear to my daughter's husband and made them understand that money will be paid by me. The day my wife returned home on that evening some villager came with an auto and informed that my daughter died by hanging. As I reached hospital, I found the police kept the dead body in the hospital morgue. On the following day the dead body was handed over to me after the P.M Exam. As the police could no step in spite of the information given by me I lodged a complaint to court after 15 days. Advocate Haridas Sinha was the lawyer engaged by me for lodging the complaint. I told the incident to the advocate. I put my thumb impressioOn in the complaint petition. One Tamjid Mia acted as negotiator of

the marriage of my daughter. Before the death of my daughter I informed Tamjid about the operation of my daughter and told him to mitigate the matter.

Accused persons are present today in the dock. Identified.

Cross-examination

Marriage was settled on decision. Elders of the either side as Baidhak to settle the marriage. Initially there was no demand from the husband side. There was no demand of dowry during settlement of marriage nor at negotiation of the marriage. There was no demand at the time of marriage also. I cannot remember the name of the villager who reported me first about the torture. I have not stated to daragababu or in the complaint petition that I received information from one man of the village. I have stated to daragababu (the Investigating Officer) that I went to the house of my daughter. But no such statement is found in 161 statement. I lodged a written complaint to police but was not accepted by police. I cannot say whether the copy of the same has been furnished to the court. It is not a fact that I have not given any complaint to police. It is not a fact that police has not investigated the case, even after receipt of the complaint from me. It is not a fact that to cover the delay for lodging the complaint I have brought up the story of filing a complaint to O.C. it is not a fact that I conspired with my other inmates of my family and brought the false complaint. I have not intimated the facts to the panchayat of Gournagar or any villagers of that area. It is not a fact that the accd. persons did not assault my daughter demanding dowry. It is not a fact that my daughter never reported me about dowry demanded. It is not a fact that my daughter was living there happily and there was not torture. In the written complaint I named 6 accused persons. It is not a fact that I have created the case falsely to harass the accused persons.

Sajna stayed in her husband's house. But after coming to the house of her
husband she was always telling that she is not happy. On several times she
wanted to leave the house of her husband. We told her to adjust in the house
of her husband. I also asked Sajna whether she is being maltreated by her
husband or not and in reply, she stated that her husband is not doing anything
to her. She also became pregnant and expressed for abortion of the baby but
we resisted her for abortion. She further told us that if she gives birth to the
child then she will be in trouble. I have visited the house of Sajna Begum. The
day on which Sajna committed suicide, at about 12 noon the mother and
brother of Sajna came to the house of Sadek Ali. I also went to the house of
Sadek Ali after being called by Sajna. After going there I told the mother and
brother of Sajna Begum that Sajna Begum is expressing for abortion of her
baby. Sajna further told that if she is not allowed for abortion, in that event she
will commit suicide. On that date Sadek Ali was absent and he went to
Bhangaghat and I came to know it from Sajna Begum. At about 4 p.m mother
and brother of Sajna left the house of Sadek Ali and before leaving they told
Sajna to live in her husband's house peacefully. Sajna never expressed before
us that her husband ever demanded for dowry. Sadek returned home at about

8 p.m from Bhangaghat. Before his reaching in the house his wife already committed suicide.

INQUEST REPORT

Ref : Tejpur P.S. U.D. Case No.14/2001, U/S 174 Cr.P.C.

In connection with the aforesaid case in presence of the witnesses and as per direction and order of Bhabatosh Talukdar (S.I) who was accompanying me, I Monoj Kr. Chanda, ASI of the Kailasahar P.S, do hereby engage myself on the dead body of deceased Sajna Begum (19) on finding her in a condition of hanging with a nylon rope on the bamboo beam on the bamboo ceiling of their east viti residential hut with her face turned towards east south direction and as per identification of Sadek Ali, husband of the deceased.

The rope hanging from the beam of the bamboo ceiling upto the throat of the deceased measures about 2 cubits and the height of the deceased is about $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft.. The two legs of the deceased are stretched on either side of her body and they are touching the ground. It shall be about $7\frac{1}{2}$ feet from the ceiling upto the floor. The neck of the deceased is bent towards the left and the knot of the rope is below the right ear. The tougue is cut.

I brought down the deceased from her hanging condition with the assistance of her relatives and on keeping the body of the deceased on a mat (bamboo made) in front of their house, I prepared the Inquest Report of her deadbody.

Complexion of the deceased is fair, Height-about $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet, facial contour is longish, Nose almost sharp and there is a gold like nose ring on the nose, Hair is black and long, Eyes are half closed, tongue is cut and teeth of the upper jaw is visible. Deep mark of hanging is seen on the throat and the plait of hair is placed on the left side. The hands are on either side of the body and their fists are almost half closed. There is pollar bangle with silver warks on her left hand and four roll gold bangles on her right hand. There is a silver chain on her neck and there are 4 safety pins and 2 amulets in it. The chest, back, ear, etc. are found normal. A green coloured printed sari and a white petticoat is seen on the wearing of the deceased. Physique of the deceased is good and her stomach is seen raised above normal and it is revealed that she has eight months pregnancy. The legs of the deceased are stretched, the deceased is made naked and is properly seen. Some marks of blood are seen on the mouth of her vagina and anus. No other marks of injury could be seen on any other place of her body. The Inquest Report on the deadbody of the deceased was prepared in sufficient light. Be it stated that today, dated 08.07.2001 A.D at

about 8 O 'Clock night during the absence of the other family members, (she) was said to have committed suicide inside their dwelling hut situated at Gournagar by way of hanging herself at the end of a nylon rope measuring about 20 cubits in length with which water was lifted from the well.

Under proper police custody the deceased is sent to the morgue through the Superintendent of the Civil Hospital, Tejpur with a view to performing P.M examination on her body and ascertaining the cause of her death as well.
