The deceased Rabi Sambaria was my elder brother. I know both the accused persons Shyam Mura and Ramesh Manki. We all live in the same locality at Budlabhata T.E.

My brother was murdered about two years ago. Myself and my deceased brother were living separately. His house was situated at a distance of about 150 feet away from my house. On one morning, I heard bulla about the homicidal death of Rabi. Accordingly, I went to the house of the deceased and found that the deadbody was lying on the ground inside the dwelling house. I also saw one cut wound on the neck. (At this stage the witness stated that his brother was still alive when he visited the P.O.). Thereafter, the injured was taken to the garden hospital, but my brother succumbed to the injuries on way to the hospital. My brother was not in a position to speak.

After the death, police came for investigation and held inquest on the deadbody. I had given thumb impression on the inquest report.

The wife of the deceased later told me that the wife of the accused Ramesh called the deceased to their house on the previous evening and for the whole night the deceased did not return home. The wife of the deceased also told me that in the morning, few persons from the locality brought her husband to their house in injured condition.

(CROSS FOR ACCUSED PERSONS)

I cannot say if the wife of the deceased had seen the accused persons assaulting her husband. When I reached the P.O., the injured was also in dying condition and he did not tell me anything.

(TO THE COURT) : Accused Ramesh is the brother in law of the deceased. The house of the said accused is situated at a distance of about 200 feet from the house of the deceased. The wife of the accused Ramesh is our sister. The accused Shyam Mura is also used to live in the house of Ramesh.

Rabi Sambaria was murdered about two years ago. I used to live adjacent to the house of the deceased. In the early morning at about 7.30 AM. I heard bulla and then I went to the house of the deceased. I found that Rabi was lying in injured condition in his house. One of the wound was on the neck and another wound was on his finger. On being enquired, the deceased Rabi told me that he was assaulted by the accused Ramesh in his house. The deceased had also named two more persons in the assault, but I have forgotten those two names. As per the deceased, he was beaten in the previous night. Thereafter, we shifted the injured to the hospital. However, Rabi died on way to the hospital.

Thereafter, police came for investigation. The I.O. had held inquest on the deadbody. Ext.1 is the inquest report and Ext.1(1) is my signature.

After the offence, the accused persons had absconded from our village. They were subsequently apprehended from another tea garden after few days by local people.

I cannot say why Rabi was killed.

(CROSS FOR ACCUSED PERSONS)

No person from the locality had seen the accused assaulting the deceased. The deceased did not tell me as to why he was assaulted. When the deceased made dying declaration to me, the chowkidar of the tea garden namely Rangso Sabor, wife of the deceased, VDP Secretary Kundan Kanda and Janmajja and few children were also present.

In the early morning while I was going to distribute duties on the garden labourers, I saw that few young people were bringing the deceased Rabi in injured condition from a small field, which was situated near the house of accused Ramesh. Within a short time, I also went to the house of the deceased. Till then he was alive. I saw one cut wound on the neck and one on the palm.

In my presence, the injured Rabi told his wife that he was assaulted by Ramesh. The deceased did not name any other assailant. Thereafter, the deceased was taken to the garden hospital. However, Rabi died in the vehicle itself.

After sometime, police case for investigation and held inquest on the deadbody. Ext.1 is the inquest report and Ext.1(2) is my signature.

Before the arrival of the police, we went in search of the accused. However, the accused persons had left their house and no one was available in their house. I had also noticed marks of blood stained in his compound and kachcha floor of the verandah was given mud wash.

The FIR was lodged by the doctor of the garden hospital and it was handed over to the police by me.

The deceased did not speak about the incident elaborately. While the deceased made dying declaration, few persons were present, including Kundan, Krishna Kanda, Haru Tanti etc.

One male deadbody of average built, dark brown in complexion, wearing half shirt and towel. Rigormortis was present in upper and lower limbs. Eyes and mouth are partially opened. Body was cold on touch.

INJURIES

- (i) One incised wound measuring 2x1 cm x muscle deep over left palm.
- (ii) One incised wound measuring 2cm x 1cm x muscle deep on middle phalynx of left ring and middle finger.
- (iii) One incised wound on palmer surface of the left thumb measuring 1.5cm x 1cm x 1cm.
- (iv) One incised wound measuring 5cm x 2cm x muscle deep on left lateral side of the neck directed downward and backward.

CRANIUM AND SPINAL CANAL

Scalp, skull, vertebrae, membrane and brain were found healthy.

THORAX

Wall and viscera were also found healthy.

ABDOMEN

Wall and viscera were found healthy.

In my opinion, cause of death is shock and haemorrhage as a result of the injuries described above. All the injuries are ante mortem and homicidal in nature, which might have been caused by heavy sharp cutting weapon. Approximate time

since death was 24 to 36 hours. In my opinion, injury No.(iv) was sufficient to cause death of a person in ordinary course of nature.

Ext.2 is the PM report and Ext2(1) is my signature.

In my presence, the EM held inquest on the deadbody in the garden hospital. Ext.1 is the said inquest report and Ext.1(4) is the signature of EM which was given in my presence. During inquest, I had noticed one cut injury on the sole of the left leg. Similarly, one cut wound of one inch size was also noticed on the left side of the neck. After inquest, the deadbody was sent to AMCH, Dibrugarh for post-mortem examination.

Then I visited Line NO.10 of Budlabeta TE where the mar-pit had taken place. I recorded the statements of wife and son of the deceased and other independent witnesses. During interrogation, I came to know that accused Ramesh Manki and Shyam Mura were involved in the crime. Accordingly, I went in search of the accused persons. Shyam Mura was available at home and he was arrested. At the relevant time, Shyam Mura was staying with Ramesh Manki. Hence, I searched his house. The search was carried out in presence of witness Kundan Kando and Suren Kachari and one dao was recovered from his house. Ext.3 is the seizure memo and Ext.3(2) IS MY SIGNATURE. Ext.3(3) is the signature of the accused Shyam Mura.

On 4.9.2002 I got message over telephone that the accused Ramesh Manki was apprehended by the villagers and the accused was detained at Kubang Tinali. INQUEST REPORT

Ref : D/Dooma PS Case No.214/2002 U/S 302 IPC

Now I, ML Sureka, Co & EM, Doomdooma Circle, having arrived at Mentan Hospital in Budlabheta tea estate, do hereby hold inquest on deceased Rabi Sambaria, son of late Sambaria, a resident of line No.10 of Budlabheta Police Station, PS Doom Dooma when Sri Bishnu Sambaria identifies the body to be his elder brother, in presence of the following witnesses.

The deceased belonged to tea community. He is a male of about 40 (forty) years. Hair (in head) is about 3 inches long. The eyes are closed. The nose is in normal condition. The hands are on the chest, the dead body is found lying in east-west direction on the open verandah of the hospital. The legs are lying parallel. The chest bears no injury. Injury caused by sharp weapon is seen in the left palm. About 1 inch deep injury caused by sharp weapon, is seen in the left side of the neck. Semen is seen in the penis. No injury is seen in the left side of the back. No cloth is seen around the waist. A light blue colour shirt is seen on the chest.

The entire body of the deceased is seen by turning it upside down. Although no other injury, except one in left side of the neck and one in the left palm, is seen in the body. Yet to ascertain the actual cause of death instruction is being given to send the body to the Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh for post mortem examination and the body is being handed over to the O/C of the Doomdooma police station.

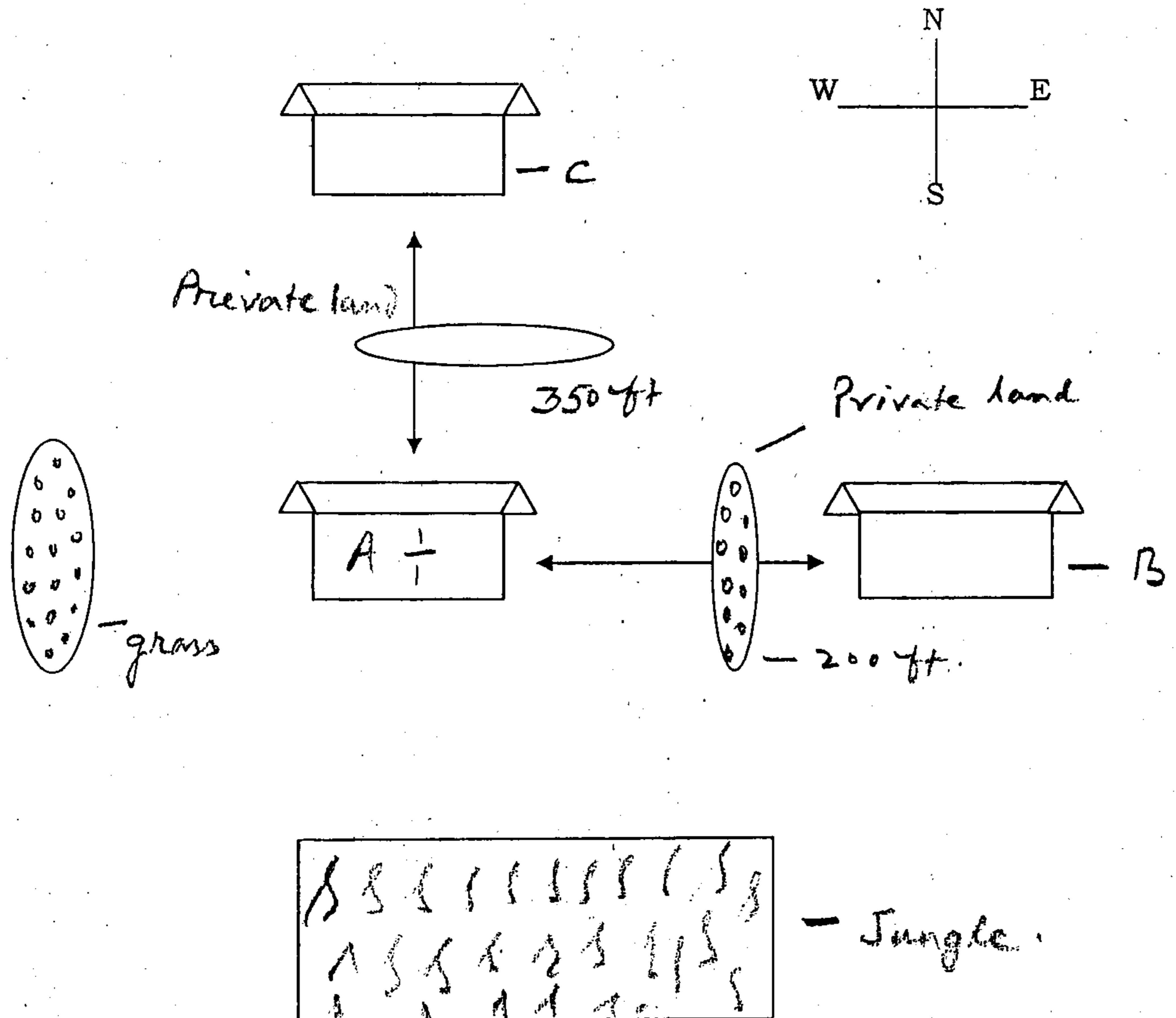
