Sir,

In connection with the aforementioned reference, I pray to you to keep the arrested accused persons in jail hajat for 14 days (from 15.01.13 to 28.01.13), i.e. till the completion of the investigation process.

Grounds of arrest: on 14.01.13, informant Sri Budhu Orang, S/o- Lt. Bijay Orang, R/o- Kachmari, P.S.- Tingkhang, appeared in the P.S. and informed the P.S. by lodging a written ejahar that his daughter Smti Bai Orang had been married off to Sri Bobo Kisko of the same village some eight years back; that she had given birth to four children after the marriage; that his son-in-law had solemnized his second marriage with another woman; that there had been disputes in their house for some days and that around 7:00 p.m. yesterday

on 13.01.2013), after picking a quarrel with the daughter of the complainant, his son-in-law and his second wife Puja Kisko strangled his daughter to death with a plastic rope. Upon receipt of the ejahar a case was registered and an investigation was made to that effect.

In the course of investigation, it could be learnt that around 7:00 p.m. on 13.01.13, the ejahar named accused persons quarreled with Bai Kisko(deceased) and then forcibly strangled her to death with a plastic rope around her neck in their residence. Sufficient incriminating materials have also been found against the accused duo. The plastic rope used by the accused persons at the time of committing the incident, was seized in presence of the witnesses.

Under the aforementioned grounds, I pray to you not to release the accused persons on bail since there is strong possibility of issuing death threat to the complainant and the witnesses by them. The grounds of the arrest are intimated to the accused persons by serving a notice as per the provisions of Section 50 Cr.P.C.

## INQUEST REPORT

I, S.I. Mahan Sena Sinha, accompanied by constable/A.S.I. Bholanath Sonowal, Deep Dihingia, Bidyut Jyoti (illegible) and Ghanakanta Gogoi, arrive at the P.O., i.e. Kachmari Gaon and start holding inquest on the dead body upon the dead body being identified by Sri Bobo Kisko (deceased's husband), S/o-Lt. No mark of injury is present on the back of the deceased, but a black mark, presumably caused as result of hanging, is seen on the neck. Excreta is seen in the anus of the dead body.

On interrogation of some neighbouring people, though it could be learnt that after picking a quarrel with her (deceased) in the night on 13/01/13, her

band and co-wife dealt punches and slaps to her and thereafter, strangled her to death with a rope, yet to ascertain the exact cause of death, the dead body is being sent to Assam Medical College and Hospital along with the relevant documents for autopsy.

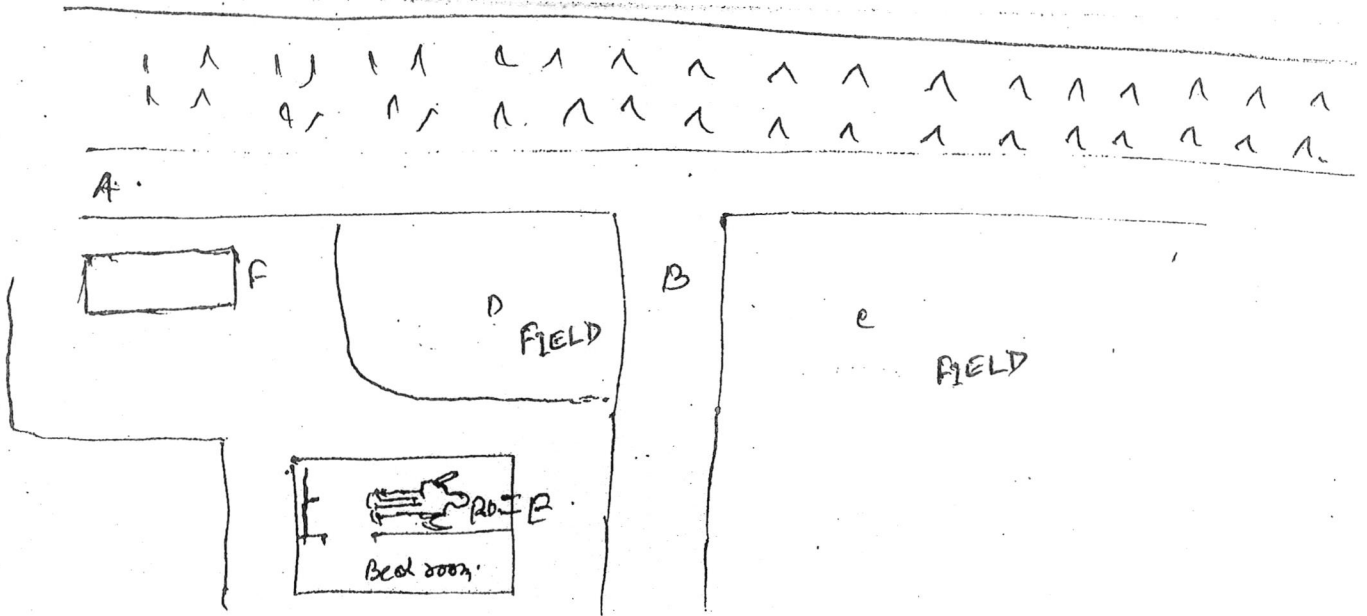





The constitution of India is the longest Constitution in the world and thereby making India the largest democracy. It is said that our Constitution is the longest and detailed constitutional document of the world. Originally it contained 395 Articles and 8 Schedules. After One Hundred and First Amendment in the year 2016, the present position of Constitution is that, it contains more than 495 Articles. Thereby, at present it has 395 Articles in original with 12 Schedules, after insertions, deletions, omissions and substitutions of Articles by various constitutional and other amendments. In addition to it, Parts IVA, IXA, IXB and XIVA and Chapter IV in Part XII were newly inserted in the Constitution. Although it is a written Constitution, the Supreme Court has held that there are implied and inherent limitations on the power of the Constituent Body to amend the basic structure of this Constitution. The Constitution of India consists of democratic principles of governance, e.g. citizenship, elections, civil servants, form of administration and the official language which have not been included by other Constitutions of the world.
